

# Emergency management plan for violence, suicidal ideation, self-harm, child abuse and student sexual assault

## Self Harm/Suicide Intent

Make sure that a staff member remains with the young person either providing verbal support or monitoring.

- Seek support from senior staff members:
- Principal
  - Assistant Principal
  - Student Welfare Coordinator
  - Year Level Coordinators

Contact Police/Emergency Services if at immediate risk of harm or requires immediate medical attention

Contact student's parents/caregiver/guardian to investigate support options

For actual attempts/self harm incidents contact Emergency Management. For all other situations contact Student Support Services

## Sexual or Physical abuse outside of school and the child is in need of protection

Make sure that a staff member remains with the young person either providing verbal support or monitoring.

## Student Sexual Assault

Separate victim and alleged perpetrator. Make sure that a staff member remains with the young person either providing verbal support or monitoring.

## Violent Behaviour

Make sure that a staff member remains with the young person either providing verbal support or monitoring.

- If the young person is being violent consider:
- removing them to another location
  - removing other students
  - observing them from a distance

- Year Level Coordinators
