# **Student Dress Code Policy**

19/11/2021

### **Purpose**

Our uniform makes a positive contribution to the culture of the College through establishing a sense of pride and identity. It enables cohesion and enhances the profile of the College and its students within the broader community.

School Council has developed this Student Dress Code after consultation with the school community. The policy provides clarity in regard to the requirements and expectations and enables students to safely engage in the many varied school activities in which they may be involved. This policy is not gender specific, nor is it season specific. The Student Dress Code is reviewed by College Council yearly.

# **Uniform Expectations:**

- All students are to be in full College Uniform every day of the school year.
- All items of uniform must be wellpresented and in good order.
- All items of clothing (including shoes) must be labelled.

 Parents/carers are asked to ensure that their child applies sunscreen
 before all outdoor activities (extra supplies are available at school).

#### **Out of Uniform**

Students out of uniform must have written or verbal communication from their parents/carers before the school day begins, explaining the reason for being out of uniform. Students with parent/carer consent must carry an Out of Uniform pass issued by their House administration.

## **Implementation**

Hampton Park Secondary College will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website (Parents L Hampton Park Secondary College (hpsc.vic.edu.au) and via the monthly Newshamper. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible. Furthermore, students will be regularly reminded about wearing the correct college uniform through assemblies, classroom posters and uniform checks.

# Breaches of Student Dress Code First breach:

- Removable item: A reminder and request to remove the incorrect item. The confiscated item will be taken to the student's House and can be collected at the end of the school day.
- Non-removable item: A reminder and request for written or verbal communication from their parent/carer before the school day begins.



### Second and further breaches:

- An escalation of consequences that may include: contacting parents/carers, confiscation of banned items (items confiscated will be stored securely and returned to student at an agreed time), detention, withdrawal from activities/class.
- For ongoing breaches parent/caregiver will be contacted by the relevant House Student Learning Leader or Head of House in which the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.

### **General Appearance**

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Hampton Park students must adhere to the following expectations:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name
- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are completely hidden. Note: hoodies are not acceptable.

#### Jewellery

- Jewellery Students are permitted to wear no more than four (4) earrings in total in their ears.
- Earrings must be either small studs or sleepers.
- Other jewellery are permitted (rings, bracelets, necklaces) permitted provided they do not present a

- safety issue and is appropriate as determined by the Principal or delegate.
- Items of a religious nature are permitted provided they do not present a safety issue and are discreet.

### **Facial Piercings**

- Facial piercing/s are permitted provided they comply with the following:
  - o Clear studs no more than 2mm in diameter.
  - Students may be asked to cover piercings with opsite tape if they present a safety issue.
  - No more than two (2) facial piercings.
  - No rings are acceptable for facial piercings.
  - The College accepts no responsibility in the event of an injury resulting from the piercing/s being torn out

#### **Accessories**

- All accessories, e.g. hats, beanies, gloves, caps, mittens, scarves, tights, leggings MUST be plain black.
- Headscarves MUST be plain black or white.

### **Cosmetics:**

 Obvious and excessive makeup and coloured nail polish must not be worn to school. Makeup and nail polish remover will be available in the House Offices.

#### Hair

- Long hair should be tied back where appropriate for safety reasons, especially in STEAM and PE classes.
- Non-natural hair colour is not permitted

#### Sun safety

 As we are a Secondary College, we expect students to take responsibility for being sun smart by wearing a school hat during outdoor activities or staying in the shade, if they are not wearing sunscreen.

Hats are <u>not</u> to be worn inside.



 Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities.
 Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

### **Out of Uniform Days**

The College runs several 'out of uniform' days over the school year as part of our community service program to raise funds for college resources or charities and the sports carnival days. Dress on these days should be smart casual and appropriate to the College context (singlet tops, tops with bare midriffs and very short shorts are not acceptable). For OH&S reasons, thongs, Ugg boots or open toed footwear is not permitted at any time.

# Exemptions to Student Dress Code

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents/carers may apply in writing to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic, or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires an exemption from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents/carers.
